Call to order/Pledge

The meeting was called to order with the Pledge of Allegiance led by Mayor Marksberry with all of Council present.

Minutes

Minutes of the December 9th and December 16th City Council meeting were distributed to Council and Mayor Marksberry prior to the meeting. After discussion a minor change from with to which was made to the December 9th Council minutes and a motion was made by Councilman Padgett to approve both sets of minutes with correction, 2nd by Councilman Powell; motion carried 5-0.

Reports from Boards and Committees

Rising Sun Regional Foundation—Ed Sullivan

Director of the Rising Sun Regional Foundation, Ed Sullivan presented Council and Mayor Marksberry with a list of grants awarded for the Fourth Quarter 2010. It was noted that nearly 60% of the grants for the quarter was awarded to Rising Sun Ohio County. Sullivan stated this varies due to applications received from the surrounding communities. Sullivan also noted the quote from Marianne Wiggers that RSRF has awarded 24.5 million in grants in 14 years which has leveraged 300 million dollars in projects. Sullivan stated RSRF is pleased to have been a part of this project and are optimistic for 2011 and beyond.

Project Manager

Northcutt presented a report to Council and Mayor Marksberry as follows:

- **Re-Cap Min Qiu 206/210 Main Street-** Northcutt informed Council and Mayor Marksberry the Re-Cap Design Committee had recommended Main Street Director Amy Hoffman use \$500 of Re-Cap funds to purchase some lighting fixtures for this building. Northcutt requested Council approval for this purchase. After discussion a motion was made by Councilman Slack to approve the recommendation of the Re-Cap Design Committee and make this lighting purchase, 2nd by Councilman Graves; motion carried 5-0. Mayor Marksberry questioned Hoffman if she was familiar with the type of lighting she was to purchase. She stated she planned to get something close to what was on the exterior of the Main Street Office Building.
- **Foutty Building-** Northcutt informed Council and Mayor Marksberry they were moving along on the Foutty Building.
- **LED Lighting—**Northcutt noted various streets throughout the City where the LED lighting had been installed.
- **Suggested 2011 Projects—** Northcutt presented a suggested list of projects to Council and Mayor Marksberry for 2011 for review. See Attached Exhibit A.

Historic Downtown Main Street

Amy Hoffman, Director of Historic Downtown Main Street had submitted a report for Council and Mayor Marksberry and is attached as Exhibit B. Hoffman informed

Council and Mayor Marksberry of the new Main Street logo and website. Visit www.risingsundowntown.com. Hoffman also announced First Friday events have been moved to Third Fridays. She stated this change was made due to various participants in the monthly drive in car show being a part of First Thursdays in another community and their wives complaining about them being away 2 days in a row.

Tourism

Mary Turner President of Tourism introduced Eric Scudder who was hired as the new Tourism Director replacing Sherry Timms who retired December 31st. Eric stated he has worked as a consultant with Tourism for 7 years. Scudder stated he has a lot of exciting ideas and looks forward to working with everyone in the community. He requested all to stop in the Tourism office and visit. Mayor Marksberry welcomed Scudder as Tourism Director.

Park Board—Jamie Bell

Park Director, Jamie Bell reported to Council and Mayor Marksberry on December and 2010 overall park activities. See attached report Exhibit C. Bell also reminded everyone it is not too late to sign up for the “Move it Ohio County” program—deadline is January 31st for this year long program.

RSMU—Marty Dennis

Clerk Gipson informed Mayor Marksberry and City Council that Marty Dennis had submitted an update of RSMU activities. See attached Exhibit D.

OCCF—Peg Dickson

Peg Dickson reported to Council and Mayor Marksberry that the first class has graduated from the Start program and one person has already been hired at Grand Victoria. The second class starts January 11th.

Petitions and Comments from Citizens

Mary Turner informed Council and Mayor Marksberry she had requested information last month from Attorney Kay Fleming. Turner stated she understood that Fleming had some other concerns this month but for whatever reason Turner had not received the requested information and had decided to make the request in writing. See attached Exhibit E. Clerk Gipson stated this request is not what Turner had requested at the December meeting—but a response would be made to Turner within 24 hours regarding when the requested information would be available.

Unfinished Business

New Business

2011 Fire Department Contract

Clerk Gipson presented the 2011 Fire Department Contract to Council and Mayor Marksberry for approval. Gipson stated the contract is the same contract we have had with the Fire Department for the past few years. She also stated no one from the Fire Department was able to attend this evening but planned to stop by City Hall and sign the contract on Friday morning. After discussion a motion was made by Councilman Slack to approve the 2011 Fire Department Contract, 2nd by Councilman Radcliff; motion carried 5-0.

Additional Appropriation Resolution—2011-1

Clerk Gipson presented the 2011-1 Additional Appropriation Resolution to Council and Mayor Marksberry for approval. Gipson briefly discussed the breakdown attached

to the Additional Appropriation. She noted various things that had been added or deleted from last year—Riverfront Phase 4 was increased from 1,500,000 to 2 million, and the Main Street Drainage Project was increased, as was the Riverboat Police to name a few. After discussion a motion was made by Councilman Padgett to approve Resolution 2011-1, 2nd by Councilman Powell; motion carried 5-0. Gipson stated projects can be added and deleted throughout the year. The breakdown is used as a guideline for budgeting.

Community Event Funding for 2011

Council had heard requests for Community Event Funding at the December 16th meeting. There was discussion that Council felt last year some cuts were so drastic the events couldn't be held. After further discussion the following funding of events was made:

- Walk Rising Sun--A motion was made by Councilman Powell to grant \$1,500 for the Walk Rising Sun Event, 2nd by Councilman Radcliff; motion carried 5-0.
- Civil War Encampment--A motion was made by Councilman Padgett to grant \$1,515 for the Civil War Encampment, 2nd by Councilman Radcliff; motion carried 5-0.
- Quilt Show-- A motion was made by Councilman Graves to grant \$3,000 for the Quilt Show, 2nd by Councilman Radcliff; motion carried 5-0.
- Health Fair-- A motion was made by Councilman Padgett to grant \$1,500 for the OCEMS Health Fair, 2nd by Councilman Powell; motion carried 5-0.
- Arts Festival --A motion was made by Councilman Powell to grant \$16,000 for the Arts Festival, 2nd by Councilman Padgett; motion carried 5-0.
- Catfish Tournament--A motion was made by Councilman Radcliff to grant \$10,000 for the Catfish Tournament, 2nd by Councilman Graves; motion carried 5-0.
- Navy Bean Festival --A motion was made by Councilman Powell to grant \$75,000 for the Navy Bean Festival, 2nd by Councilman Radcliff; motion carried 5-0.
- After Prom--A motion was made by Councilman Slack to grant \$5,000 for the After Prom, 2nd by Councilman Graves; motion carried 5-0.
- Car Show--A motion was made by Councilman Graves to grant \$19,000 for the Car Show Event, 2nd by Councilman Radcliff; motion carried 5-0.
- Prom Committee--A motion was made by Councilman Padgett to grant \$2,000 for the Prom Committee, 2nd by Councilman Graves; motion carried 5-0.
- OC Fairboard--A motion was made by Councilman Powell to grant \$2,000 for the Beef Show and \$4,000 for the Tractor Pull, 2nd by Councilman Radcliff; motion carried 5-0.
- Music On Main--A motion was made by Councilman Padgett to grant \$3,000 for the Music on Main event, 2nd by Councilman Graves, motion carried 5-0.
- Fireworks--A motion was made by Councilman Graves to grant \$9,000 for the Lions Club Fireworks, 2nd by Councilman Radcliff; motion carried 5-0.

Resolution 2011-2 Memorial Contribution --Fred W. Ross

Clerk Gipson proposed Resolution 2011-2 "A Resolution in Re Memorial Contributions to the John G. Roeder Library Enrichment Fund in Re Memorial of Fred W. Ross" to Council and Mayor Marksberry for review. Gipson stated in the past the City has donated \$3,000 to the Ohio County Community Foundation or a fund within the OCCF in memory of the deceased's public service. Fred W. Ross was Mayor from 1988 to 1991. After discussion a motion was made by Councilman Slack to approve

Resolution 2011-2 in the amount of \$3,000, 2nd by Councilman Graves; motion carried 5-0.

Resolution 2011-3 Memorial Contribution –Mel Wahlert

Clerk Gipson proposed Resolution 2011-3 “A Resolution in Re Memorial Contributions to the Ohio County Community Foundation in Re Memorial of Mel Wahlert” to Council and Mayor Marksberry for review. Wahlert was City Engineer and City Planner for the City from 1995-97 and was heavily involved in the Project Development Agreement and infrastructure upgrades with the addition of the riverboat casino. After discussion a motion was made by Councilman Slack to approve Resolution 2011-3 in the amount of \$3,000, 2nd by Councilman Padgett; motion carried 5-0.

Resolution 2011-4 Amendment to HRA Plan

Clerk Gipson presented Resolution 2011-4 “An Amendment to the HRA Plan” to Council and Mayor Marksberry for approval. According to Attorney Siekman when the City began the HRA it was created by Resolution. Therefore any amendments to the HRA Plan have to be adopted by Resolution. After discussion a motion was made by Councilman Padgett to give Mayor Marksberry the authority to sign the amendment to the HRA Plan, 2nd by Councilman Powell; motion carried 5-0.

Resoluion 2011-5 Amendment to HRA Plan Description

Clerk Gipson presented Resolution 2011-5 “An Amendment to the HRA Plan Description” to Council and Mayor Marksberry for approval. According to Attorney Siekman the changes to the Plan Description is a change that needs to be approved by Council in order to continue to offer the HRA to employees. After discussion a motion was made by Councilman Graves to give Mayor Marksberry the authority to sign the amendment to the HRA Plan Description, 2nd by Councilman Slack; motion carried 5-0.

Ordinance 2011-1 First Reading “An Ordinance Adopting a Supplement to the Code of Ordinances of the City of Rising Sun”

Mayor Marksberry presented Ordinance 2011-1 “An Ordinance Adopting a Supplement to the Code of Ordinances of the City of Rising Sun” for first reading. This Ordinance will be addressed for 2nd reading at the February 2011 City Council meeting. If Council has any questions they should contact Mayor Marksberry or Attorney Siekman.

Ordinance 2011-2 First Reading “An Ordinance Providing the Control of Noise in the City of Rising Sun, Indiana”

Mayor Marksberry presented Ordinance 2011-2 “An Ordinance Providing the Control of Noise in the City of Rising Sun, Indiana” for first reading. This Ordinance will be addressed for 2nd reading at the February 2011 City Council meeting. If Council has any questions they should contact Mayor Marksberry or Attorney Siekman. Chief Hewitt was asked if he could get a comparison as to what 83 decibels sounds like.

INDOT Amended MOU re: SR 56

Mayor Marksberry presented the Amended MOU between INDOT, City of Rising Sun, Ohio County and American StructurePoint to Council for approval. Clerk Gipson distributed a memo from Attorney Kay Fleming regarding the changes included in the amendment. According to information received we need to have this document signed by January 20th or funding for this project will be pushed to 2012. It was determined the most substantial change is an addition of \$10,000 to be paid to American StructurePoint to attend meetings etc. After discussion a motion was made by

Councilman Padgett to give Mayor Marksberry approval to sign the Amended SR56 MOU, 2nd by Councilman Slack; motion carried 5-0.

Resolution 2011-6 "A Resolution to Appoint a President Pro Tempore of the Common Council"

Mayor Marksberry presented Resolution 2011-6 "A Resolution to Appoint a President Pro Tempore of the Common Council" to Council for Approval. Marksberry stated this is Council's pleasure but reported that currently Councilman Slack serves as Pro-Tem and has attended meetings regarding the sale of the Grand Victoria; and would request that Slack continue as Councilman Pro-Tem to keep some consistency in the continuance of these meetings during this period. After discussion a motion was made to approve Resolution 2011-6 with Councilman Slack continuing as Pro-Tem for the 2011 year by Councilman Powell, 2nd by Councilman Graves; motion carried 5-0.

Miscellaneous

- Attorney Siekman introduced Blayr Barnard and Kelly Will with the Small Business Development Center. They gave a presentation of what they offer to businesses and what they can offer the City. They requested funding in the amount of \$7,500 to help with their business resources.
- Mayor Marksberry presented a list of appointments See attached exhibit F for 2011. Marksberry stated he plans to reappoint all of his listed appointments except Ray Parker who can no longer attend the Port Authority meeting due to his work schedule. Councilman Slack made a motion to appoint Bud Radcliff to the Redevelopment Commission, 2nd by Councilman Powell; motion carried.

After the reviewing and signing of claims, and with no further business before Council; a motion to adjourn was made by Councilman Padgett, 2nd by Councilman Powell; meeting adjourned at 8:40 pm.

Rising Sun Municipal Utilities

The Electric operating account has a balance of approx. \$2,065,000.00

Phase 2 of the SR56 Bridge project is starting this week. Our distribution lines have to be moved back across the highway to the original site. This entire project is being reimbursed from INDOT.

LED streetlights are here and being installed. Our target is to get them installed by the end of February.

We had a few faults in 2010 that resulted in substation fuses being blown and causing brown-out conditions for some customers. Alpha Engineering and ESM Testing ran some tests on different components of our substation to find the reason why the high voltage fuses were blowing. The tests included infrared testing for hotspots, oil tests on the regulators and transformers, and phantom load testing on the reclosers. A report was given to us with recommendations for replacing the current fuse assemblies with ones able to carry a higher load current and to completely disassemble and service the regulators. I have it in the budget for 2011 and we plan to get it done in late March.

Other projects I have in the 2011 budget include: Bringing in a new feed to the Fairgrounds from Nelson Rd (currently it is fed on the same distribution as the trailer court) and Changing the distribution lines around Thuermer Hollow to accommodate the SR56 project.

I am checking into replacement of the Electric Dept's '98 Chevrolet flatbed pickup.

The Water operating account has a balance of approx. \$667,000.00

The new Well 1R is pumping an average of 920 gallons per minute, well above what it was designed to be. We did have an issue with the new fluoride injection pump a few months ago, but it has been replaced. Also, we installed a new well and storage tank monitor with remote access.

Earlier this year we had both water storage tanks inspected. A report was submitted to us with recommendations for adjusting the windage support rods on both tanks and to paint the McConnell tank internally and externally. There are some other small recommendations that we will take care of internally. The windage rods have been adjusted on both tanks. I put the McConnell tank painting in the budget for 2011 and plan to have it done this summer.

Another project I have in the 2011 budget is: Replacement of water main along Turner Rd, Park Ave, and Highland Ave (this area has 2" galvanized pipe in place now, we have had many leaks).

The Sewer operating account has a balance of approx. \$264,000.00

Projects I have in the 2011 budget include: Sewer main coating at Willow St and Lincoln St(these are problem areas with some cracks and root intrusion), Manhole coating at Sixth St and Breezy Ln(the manholes are showing corrosion and cracking), and Preventative maintenance on the centrifuge at the plant.

Internal projects for us in 2011 are: Go through the plant to find additional ways of conserving energy and Continue with sewer camera schedule to find potential problem areas.

I am checking into replacement of the Sewer Dept's '98 Chevrolet pickup.

The Broadband operating account has a balance of approx. \$23,000.00

We had some setbacks with the Broadband in 2011. The change of bandwidth provider, which had to be done, took longer to complete than anticipated. As a result, it delayed our testing and installation of new customers. Also, increased competition and competitor bundle packages in the area has taken some customers away. At the beginning of 2010 we had approximately 550 customers. We are now at approximately 500 customers. We are back into testing and installation now, so the customer base should start rising again.

Projects I have in the 2011 budget include: Installing the tower on Woods Ridge(this was planned for 2010) and Switching current customers with availability for 5.8Ghz over from 900Mhz(this will get them better service and free up the 900Mhz frequency).

Our RB Broadband request for 2011 is \$85,000.00. This utility still needs help to take care of maintenance and some materials.
